- 6. What is the significance of the two church names—Abiding Truth and NEW CREATION!!!? In which church would you feel most comfortable?
- 7. In what ways do each of the main characters change over the course of the novel?
- 8. How might this novel read differently had it been written from the point of view of different characters, such as Clarence, Dougie, or Dorothy Moyers?
- 9. Do you think *Ash Wednesday* presents an accurate portrayal of small town life? Why or why not?
- 10. If you were to give a different title to Ash Wednesday what would it be?



#### **Digging Deeper**


- 1. Allan Weiss supposes "that if people saw him as he actually was rather than the way they imagined him to be, they would dismiss him as a hypocrite." (page 39) Do you agree with his self-assessment? Why or why not?
- 2. Sophie tells Betty, "There's those secrets we keep from ourselves." (page 183) What secrets do the characters in *Ash Wednesday* keep from themselves and how do those secrets impact the story?
- 3. The character Vera appears throughout the novel in various incarnations. Who is she? How does she contribute to the story? Have you met Vera? Where? What form did she take?
- 4. In her encounter with Allan, Vera says, "You have to love someone." (pgs 224-225) In what ways is her message a recurring theme throughout the novel?
- 5. In what ways are the characters more likely to see what they believe than to believe what they see?
- 6. Margaret tells Gerald, "You still see the world in black and white." (page 52) How does the contrast between somber and more vivid colors throughout *Ash Wednesday* affect the mood of the novel?
- 7. What do you think of Edna's efforts to oust Gerald in light of the revelation she makes in chapter 22?



- 8. Why do you think each of the following themes are repeated throughout the novel?
  - a. There are no secrets in Dustin.
  - b. You're always an ass to someone.
  - c. You can't win the battle with dust.
  - d. A Mother Always Knows.
- 9. In what ways does *Ash Wednesday* explore the relationship between sexuality and religion?
- 10. What is the significance of Allan's dream on page 219? How does it contrast with Gerald's recurring dream?
